- Sharing intellectual property without permission to do so is prohibited.
- Conversations taking place at re:ipl may be recorded. Your participation is consent to be recorded. These recordings may be used for promotional, educational, and informational purposes.

- THE AGENDA -

These discussion topics are meant to be thought-provoking to encourage people to go into a breakout room for a deep dive into specific topics.
